





Using Cognates with ELLs/Usando cognados con ELLs

Cognates are words in two languages that share a similar meaning, spelling, and pronunciation. While English may share very few cognates with a language like Chinese, 30-40% of all words in English have a related word in Spanish. For Spanish-speaking ELLs, cognates are an obvious bridge to the English language. Words in different languages related to the same root, e.g. *education* (English) and *educación* (Spanish), (Colorin Colorado, 2007).

Los **cognados** son palabras en dos idiomas que comparten un significado, ortografía y pronunciación similares. Si bien el inglés puede compartir muy pocos cognados con un idioma como el chino, entre el 30 y el 40% de todas las palabras en inglés tienen una palabra relacionada en español. Para los estudiantes ELL de habla hispana, los cognados son un puente obvio hacia el idioma inglés. Palabras en diferentes idiomas relacionadas con la misma raíz, p.e. educaction (inglés) y educación (español), (Colorin Colorado, 2007).

Message from Nurse Drogosz

**IMPORTANT REMINDER

The child health exam is required for entrance into Preschool, Kindergarten and 6th grade and/or transferring from an out of state school. The health history portion of the physical exam form must be completed and signed by the parent in order for the physical to be valid. The State of Illinois requires that all student health exams be submitted before October 15 of the year of the required exam or within 30 days of enrollment for new students from out of state.

The State of Illinois requires that all students entering Kindergarten or entering school for the first time from out of state shall have an eye exam before by October 15, 2023 of the year of the required exam or within 30 days of enrollment for new students from out of state.

The State of Illinois requires that all students in Kindergarten, second and sixth grades have an oral health exam performed by a licensed dentist.

Illinois requirement is the sports physical must be completed each year and returned to the coaches before the student is allowed to participate in practice or interscholastic sports.

Please schedule an appointment if the exam has not been done and submit as soon as possible.
