Welcome to the 2nd quarter! It is hard to believe that we have already completed the 1st quarter of the 2023-2024 school year. I am writing to discuss two upcoming events for our school.

On Tuesday, October 31st, we will be celebrating the Autumn Season with several Fall activities. This is the first time in several years that students will be in school on October 31st. Students will have the opportunity to complete different arts and crafts, play games, as well as enjoy a food item donated by Parents for Children (PFC). As a follow up from multiple Willow Weeklys and Quarter 1 Progress reports, students and staff are not allowed to wear Halloween costumes. Anyone who wears a costume (including face paint, costume wigs, etc.) will be asked to change and or remove the item(s). Tuesday will be a day of celebrating the Fall season.



SUPERKIDS

3RD GRADE

10/27/23

LA

This week, we continue to be animal researchers, learning about more vertebrates and preparing to write an informational paragraph. We will determine what prefixes **re**-and **pre**-mean and how they are added to root words. Grammar skills include abstract nouns and reviewing other parts of speech. Spelling words will have a CVCe pattern with -ed and -ing endings and we will have a test this week.

Math

Last week we started our new topic of using a number line to round, skip count, add, and subtract. We will continue this week.

Social

We will begin studying ancient communities in North America..

Science

Students investigate more about how gravity makes objects fall, particularly whether gravity acts between two objects, as touching forces and magnetic forces do. The class concludes that when they observe evidence of gravity, Earth is one of the two objects involved.

LA

This week, we will refer to details and examples in the text when explaining why knights and castles were needed in the Middle Ages. Students will use their knowledge of the prefixes **un**— and **non**— and root words to read and interpret unfamiliar words. Students will be forming and using prepositional phrases.

Math

Last week we worked on comparing and ordering fractions using multiple strategies and will continue this week.

Social

We will be studying famous Americans who made a difference in history. Students will investigate and report on a person they select.

Science

Students read Energy Past and Present to understand how electrical devices have so many different output energy forms, even though they are plugged into the same electrical system.

ILA

Students will distinguish between root words and words with il— and ir— prefixes. Students will identify subjects and predicates in sentences and identify run-on sentences.

Last week we started our new topic of finding patterns in place value and will continue this week.

Social

We will be finishing The Age of Exploration.

science

Students visualize an experiment in which they imagine people all over the planet standing and dropping rocks at the same time in order to stimulate their initial ideas about gravity. To introduce the Investigation Question: If Earth is spinning, which way is up?



English Language Arts



6th Grade Unit 2: Surviving Middle School

Middle School by Luke Reynolds. Students are learning how to treat each other with kindness and compassion as well as how their author structures their text to convey important ideas or concepts to their reader. Students will continue to work with their novel to learn how to reflect as they grow into adolescents.



ELA


7th Grade Unit 2: Restart


Students are more than halfway through their novel Restart, by Gordon Korman. This week they focused on how the author develops and contrasts the points of views of different characters. Next week they will start preparing for their literary analysis.



8th Grade Unit 2: Bruiser

Students have really been enjoying their novel study of Bruiser, by Neal Shusterman. They have already studied point of view during this novel. Students will begin analyzing how the author creates suspense in the novel next week. By the time we finish reading this book, students should be able to connect or relate to one of the many main characters.





What we're learning

6TH

<u>Decimals</u>: In this topic, students begin by reviewing number skills developed in previous grades: plotting decimals on a number line and comparing and ordering decimal values.

They then use place value strategies to establish the standard algorithm for adding and subtracting decimals.

7TH

Proportional Relationships: In this topic, students use their knowledge of proportionality to solve real-world-problems about money. They solve various multistep ratio and percent problems, including tips, commissions, gratuities, simple interest, taxes, markups, and markdowns.

8TH

From Proportions to Linear Relationships: In this topic, students connect proportional relationships, lines, and linear equations. They compare proportional relationships represented in different ways to ensure a firm understanding of the meaning of proportionality. They review the constant of proportionality, k, as a rate of change and assign the new term slope to describe the steepness and direction for any line, not only proportional relationships.

6-8 Science with Amplify Science

6th Grade

This week we have completed our unit on the Microbiome. We will begin our next unit - Metabolism on Monday. We will review how the body takes in molecules and how they are converted into what the body needs through eating and breathing.

7th Grade

This week we created physical models of plate motion. Next week we will have a quiz and will begin to explore the different plate boundaries found around the world with a strong focus on Iceland.

8th Grade

This week we discussed how force affects the motion of objects and opposing forces. Next week we will continue with these ideas as we try to determine what caused a rocket to change direction. We will continue to work on Forces with the addition of Mass and Velocity.

How to engage at home

Meter:

If you listen to music at home, ask your students to see if they can find the meter of a song and show you the strong/weak beats that make up the music. They will be able to clap the strong beat and pat the remaining weak beats out.

Rhythms:

When listening to music at home, ask your students to recreate rhythms from music they hear. This can be a drum pattern, the rhythm of a vocal melody, or a little sound effect in the background of the music.




