





English Language Arts



6th Grade Unit 2: Surviving Middle School

Students will finish reading their novel <u>Surviving Middle School</u> by Luke Reynolds. Students are learning how to treat each other with kindness and compassion as well as how their author structures their text to convey important ideas or concepts to their reader. Next week students will demonstrate their understanding by creating a One Pager that focuses on showing student comprehension of the text and applying the skills they have learned throughout the novel.


7th Grade

Unit 3: Social Media/Informational Texts
This week, students analyzed informational texts and discussed the effects of social media on their health and relationships. Next week, students will start finding the best textual evidence to support the claim that social media can both risky and beneficial to adolescents.



8th Grade Unit 2: Bruiser

Students took their final test for the novel, <u>Bruiser</u>, by Neal Shusterman on Friday, November 17th. Students have not finished the book, but have taken 2 summative assessments (tests) on the the book and the skills that they have been working on so far. As we continue to finish the book students will focus on taking notes of how the main characters have changed and grown throughout the book so they can write a character analysis essay when they return after Thanksgiving.

What we're learning

6TH

Ratios: Students will compare ratios to solve problems. They will also determine equivalent ratios and use tables to represent equivalent ratios.

7

Adding and Subtracting Rational Numbers: In this topic, students use number lines and two-color counters to model addition and subtraction of integers before developing rules for the sum and difference of signed numbers. They begin by walking a number line to visualize adding integers. Students transition from physical movement to modeling the motion on number lines.

8TH

Linear Relationships: In this topic, students develop fluency with analyzing linear relationships, writing equations of lines, and graphing lines. They use intuition and prior knowledge about writing equations, creating tables of values, and graphing equations to compare two linear relationships. From there, students learn to calculate the slope of linear relationships represented in tables and from contexts, connecting the geometric representations used in the previous topic with the algebraic processes used to calculate the slope.

6-8 Science with Amplify Science

6th Grade

We have been working on understanding what cells need in order to survive. We will continue to try to identify cells need in order to thrive. We have read about 4 types of illness that are common to kids and how they might be affecting Elise. We are trying to use reasoning to identify what is wrong with her.

7th Grade

This week we focused on learning about the rate of movement and how we value fossil evidence and additional human history. Next week we will be summarizing the unit and preparing for the test.

8th Grade

This week we discussed how force affects the motion of objects and opposing forces trying to determine what caused a rocket to change direction. We will continue to work on Forces with the addition of Mass and Velocity. We will finalize the unit this friday.

Lithuanian Harvest Festival Lietuvos derliaus šventė

Nubaigai is the harvest festival held in Lithuania. In Lithuania, the Thanksgiving tradition involves the creation of a Boba which is then wrapped around the worker who bound the last sheaf.

The harvest wreath is then carried in a plate covered with a white linen cloth. As the procession moves on, people who reaped sing an old song which represents how they rescued the crop from a huge bison that tried to devour it.

Luego la corona de la cosecha se lleva en un plato cubierto con un paño de lino blanco. A medida que avanza la procesión, los segadores cantan una antigua canción que describe cómo salvaron la cosecha de un enorme bisonte que intentó devorarla.

Cell Phone / Smart Watch Policy

Student cell phones/smart watches should be turned off and out of sight during the regular school day from 8:30-3:13. This means that a student may carry a phone/smart watch during the school day, but it should not be seen by staff or other students. However, I strongly encourage students to leave their cell phones/smart watches in their locker and or backpack. Please see the cell phone/smart watch expectations/procedures listed below.

• Cell Phone/Smart Watch Violation 1:

A student has their cell phone/smart watch visible and/or it is in use. A staff member will confiscate the phone/watch and turn it into the front office. The student will report to the front office at the end of the day to get their phone/watch.

Guardian(s) will be called and informed of the cell phone/smart watch violation.

• Cell Phone/Smart Watch Violation 2:

A student has their cell phone/smart watch visible and/or it is in use. A staff member will confiscate the phone/watch and turn it into the front office. Guardian(s) will be called and informed of the cell phone/smart watch violation. Cell phone/Smart Watch will remain in the front office until it is picked up by the Guardian(s). The cell phone/smart watch will not go home with the student.

• Cell Phone/Smart Watch Violation 3:

A student has their cell phone/smart watch visible and/or it is in use.

A staff member will confiscate the phone and turn it into the front office.

Guardian(s) will be called and informed of the cell phone violation.

Cell phone/smart watch will remain in the front office until it is picked up by the Guardian(s). The cell phone/smart watch will not go home with the student.

Administration will work with the student and guardian to create an individualized plan regarding the cell phone/smart watch being present in school.

I thank you for your support as we make a more consistent effort to refocus on academics and limit the distractions of cell phones. Violations will start over every quarter. As always, please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.
