





We will be studying immigration and what life was like traveling to and living in America.





Students revisit the Floating Paper Clip Device and find ways to make the paper clip fall. Through class discussion and diagramming, students discover that each way of making the paper clip fall involves changing the balanced forces to unbalanced forces.







Students will take our end of Unit 2 Assessment. They have reviewed subject/predicate parts of a sentence. We also discussed parts of speech - nouns, action and linking verbs, adjectives and adverbs. In word structure, we learned the root "arch", and prefixes un, non, and en. Students are finishing their final copy of their persuasive essay.

This week, we practiced adding and subtracting large numbers with regrouping. Next week, we will continue working with these skills and take the Topic 5 test.

We will be studying the nation's economy.

Students are introduced to their first hands-on design challenge: to design and build a wind turbine. In this lesson, students engage in a student-driven learning sequence in which they design their wind turbines.

# 5th Grade






# 8th Grade Conveying Courage



- 1. Being an open and active listener shows your child that their feelings are normal and healthy.
- Do your best not to dismiss negative emotions such as; unhappiness, anger, grumpiness, frustration, and so on. Instead, be there for your child without trying to rush them out of their feelings.
- 3. Reassure your child that everyone feels emotions.

# Ms. Baricovich S.I. K-2 & 4th Grade Classes with ClearMath

Kindergarten-We are starting Topic 5-Students will learn that joining two quantities is adding, be introduced to the addition and equal symbol, begin to learn that stories can be told with numbers, learn that taking away is subtraction, as well as learn the subtraction symbol.

**1st Grade**-We are continuing Topic 4-Exploring grouping by tens and ones through the use of connecting cubes, working with 2 digit numbers on the number line and locating multiples of 10, and adding and subtracting multiples of 10 with 2 digit numbers.

2nd Grade-We started Topic 3-In this topic, students apply their understanding of the base-10 system to add and subtract 2-and 3-digit numbers. They develop multiple strategies for adding and subtracting, including adding and subtracting multiples of 10.

**4th Grade-**We are continuing Topic 4<sup>-</sup>Students extend their work with place value to learn about tenths and hundredth in decimal notation. They will model decimal quantities using base-10 blocks and 10-by-10 grids, recognize the connection between decimals and fractions.

# Christmas around the world: Spotlight Israel Navidad alrededor del mundo: Destacando a Israel





The Jewish festival of lights, called Hanukkah, is celebrated around the world today. But the inspiration for the holiday dates back thousands of years in what is today the country of Israel. In 2023, Hanukkah starts the evening of December 7 and ends on December 15. To celebrate the ancient miracle of the oil burning a candle for eight nights, Jews celebrating Hanukkah light a candleholder called a menorah for eight nights. The menorah holds nine candles—one for each night plus a candle called the shamash used to light the other candles.

On the first night, one candle is added to the menorah and lit. On the second night, another candle is added and lit. The adding and lighting of candles continues for eight nights. During these moments, people recite special blessings and prayers, sing songs, and exchange gifts to celebrate the miracle in the temple more than 2,000 years ago.

La fiesta judía de las luces, llamada Hanukkah, se celebra hoy en todo el mundo. Pero la inspiración para esta festividad se remonta a miles de años en lo que hoy es el país de Israel. En 2023, Hanukkah comienza la noche del 7 de diciembre y finaliza el 15 de diciembre. Para celebrar el antiguo milagro del aceite que quema una vela durante ocho noches, los judíos que celebran Hanukkah encienden un candelabro llamado menorá durante ocho noches. La menorá tiene nueve velas, una para cada noche más una vela llamada shamash que se usa para encender las otras velas.

La primera noche, se agrega una vela a la menorá y se enciende. En la segunda noche, se añade y enciende otra vela. La colocación y encendido de velas continúa durante ocho noches. Durante estos momentos, la gente recita bendiciones y oraciones especiales, canta canciones e intercambia regalos para celebrar el milagro en el templo hace más de 2.000 años.

# Message trom Nurse Drogosz

#### \*\*IMPORTANT REMINDER

#### **Common Illness & School Attendance Reminder**

Students are expected to attend school every day. However, illnesses can be lengthy and sometimes difficult deciding whether or not to send your child to school. The following information may be helpful in making your decision. Please be sure and provide your current phone number and the available emergency contact information. If your child is going to be absent, please call our attendance line-(708)-467-3650. You must leave your child's name, the reason for the absence, the date of the absence and your name to verify that it was a parent/guardian that is verifying the absence.

#### Fever:

Any temperature greater than 100 degrees F is considered a fever. Child must be fever free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medications (such as Tylenol, Motrin, Advil, etc.) in order to return to school. This applies even if the underlying cause of the fever is non-infectious, such as middle ear infections, bronchitis, urinary tract infections, etc. Children with a fever do not usually feel well enough to participate and attend school activities. It is recommended that they be given 24 hours to recover from the fever before returning to school. Please note that a child who exhibits symptoms of illness without a fever may be sent home if the nurse feels this is in the best interest of the child or the child's classmates (with compromised immune systems).

#### Colds:

Children with an upper respiratory infection without a fever may attend school if they feel well enough to do so. It is helpful in preventing the spread of illness if children learn to use tissues to cover sneezes and coughs, and wash hands after contact with the secretions.

#### Infections:

Any child who has been on antibiotic therapy for 24 hours is no longer considered infectious and may return to school. This includes infections of the eye, nose(green discharge), skin and strep infections. (Exception is pink eye, not all doctors treat this, so the doctor or nurse will decide if exclusion is necessary to protect others from being contaminated).

#### Diarrhea:

Children with diarrhea should remain home until they are symptom free for 24 hours. The only exception is if diarrhea is the result of a chronic condition, then a note from the doctor is needed indicating the diarrhea is not infectious.

#### **Vomiting**

A child who has vomited the evening before or in the morning before school should remain home for the day.

#### Rash:

If your child has a rash all over his body (bright red, raised, or itchy) or a rash in one or more areas that is draining fluid. The nurse will determine the next action to be taken.

#### **Common Childhood Diseases**

If a child has chicken pox, measles, or any other known treatable contagious disease, they must be kept home until they are no longer contagious. For most common childhood diseases, the period of contagion is known. Consult Nurse Drogosz.
