Dear Willow Families,

School Year 2023/24

I wanted to take a moment to provide you with a few friendly reminders about our expectations for student drop-off and pick-up at Willow. The safety of our students is our number one priority and following these guidelines will help maintain a safe environment for our students, staff, and parents.

If parents choose to drive students to school, they should be dropped off on Vinewood between 8:10 and 8:25 AM. Students may **NOT** be dropped off in the front parking lot off of Archer Ave. The yellow highlighted area depicts where drop off should take place. The red arrows provide guidance as to the drop off route. Please see the picture below.




Our regular school day ends at 3:13 PM and every Wednesday at 2:13 PM. Students may be picked up on Vinewood at that time. Students are **NOT** to be picked up in our parking lot off Archer Ave. Please follow the same routes as above. If students have not been picked up 15 minutes after the bell, they will be brought to the main office and parents will be contacted. Parking expectations for late pickups are the same as for late drop offs.

If students arrive at school after 8:30 AM they should be dropped off in the front of the building. Individuals that drop off students after 8:30 AM should park in our lot (depicted by the green marks on the map below) and walk students into the main office. Cars should NEVER park or stop to drop students in the area marked by red Xs on the map. This is our bus drop off location and cars parking in this area can lead to an unsafe parking lot. TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN PRE-REGISTRATION AND SCREENING

Willow Springs School District # 108, 8345 Archer Ave, Willow Springs IL 60480, will hold a transitional kindergarten (4 year olds) **pre-registration and screening** on Tuesday, March 5, 2024. Registration will take place from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The screening of your child is very important and will take approximately 30-45minutes.

If your child will be <u>four years old on or before September 1, 2024</u>, and has not qualified for Early Childhood Special Education programming he/she might be eligible to enter our transitional kindergarten program for the 2024/2025 school year. This program is an open enrollment-lottery system*.

*If students have a fourth birthday after September 1, 2024, and there are open seats in the classroom, the parent may register their child on or after their birthday in order to attend the Transitional Kindergarten program and begin on a rolling admission.

In order to pre-register your child, you must bring with you **ONE** proof of residency. This must be a current State ID, Driver's License, lease, mortgage bill, or property tax bill. A copy of your child's original Birth Certificate is also required. ONLY the parent and the child should attend this appointment. To register please call Ms. Flores in the school office 708-839-6828.

Willow Springs School will hold a Kindergarten screening for new incoming kindergarten (5 year olds) students in August. Please call the school in July for more information.




8th Grade

SOCIAL WORK

Explain to your child that they will always be surrounded by people who are different from them. In order to respect and value these differences, teach your child to celebrate diversity of all kinds. Remind them that a person's cultural background heavily influences their beliefs and opinions. Therefore, everyone thinks differently because of who they are and where they come from. What a beautiful thing!

- What is the difference between a fact and an opinion?
- How can you share your opinion respectfully?
- Do people have to agree with your opinion?
- Where do you think people's opinions come from?
- 1. Children may need help distinguishing fact from opinion. Help them better understand by providing clear examples.
- 2. Share an example of a time when you formed your own opinion about something. For example, maybe you think winter is the best season because you have special childhood memories of playing in the snow. Or perhaps you think popcorn is gross because of the time you ate too much of it and got sick. Follow up by explaining to your child how a person's experience helps shape their opinion.
- 3. Provide an example of a time you disagreed with someone else's opinion. Explain to your child how you handled it.

Spotlight: Serbia and Lithuania



Statehood Day (Serbian Cyrillic: Дан државности, romanized: Dan državnosti), also known as the Sretenje (Serbian Cyrillic: Сретење), is a holiday celebrated every 15 February in Serbia to commemorate the outbreak of the First Serbian Uprising in 1804, which evolved into the Serbian Revolution against Ottoman rule. On the same day in 1835, the first modern Serbian constitution, known as the "Sretenje Constitution" or "Candlemas Constitution".

El Día de la Estatalidad (serbio cirílico: Дан државности, romanizado: Dan državnosti), también conocido como Sretenje (serbio cirílico: Сретење), es un feriado celebrado cada 15 de febrero en Serbia para conmemorar el estallido del Primer Levantamiento Serbio en 1804, que evolucionó hacia la Revolución Serbia contra el dominio otomano. El mismo día en 1835, se promulgó la primera constitución moderna serbia, conocida como la "Constitución de Sretenje" o "Constitución de la Candelaria".



The day of restoration of Independence of Lithuania is a Lithuanian national holiday celebrated on 11 March in commemoration of the Act of the Re-Establishment of the State of Lithuania that the Constituent Assembly signed in 1990. It is one of the three principal national holidays in Lithuania, along with the Day of the Re-Establishment of the Statehood of Lithuania on 16 February and the Statehood Day on 6 July.

El Día de la Restauración de la Independencia de Lituania es un feriado nacional lituano celebrado el 11 de marzo en conmemoración del Acta de Restablecimiento del Estado de Lituania que la Asamblea Constituyente firmó en 1990. Es uno de los tres principales feriados nacionales en Lituania, junto con el Día del Restablecimiento de la Estatalidad de Lituania el 16 de febrero y el Día del Estado el 6 de julio.





**IMPORTANT REMINDER

Common Illness & School Attendance Reminder

Students are expected to attend school every day. However, illnesses can be lengthy and sometimes difficult deciding whether or not to send your child to school. The following information may be helpful in making your decision. Please be sure and provide your current phone number and the available emergency contact information. If your child is going to be absent, please call our attendance line-(708)-467-3650. You must leave your child's name, the reason for the absence, the date of the absence and your name to verify that it was a parent/guardian that is verifying the absence.

Fever:

Any temperature greater than 100 degrees F is considered a fever. Child must be fever free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medications (such as Tylenol, Motrin, Advil, etc.) in order to return to school. This applies even if the underlying cause of the fever is non-infectious, such as middle ear infections, bronchitis, urinary tract infections, etc. Children with a fever do not usually feel well enough to participate and attend school activities. It is recommended that they be given 24 hours to recover from the fever before returning to school. Please note that a child who exhibits symptoms of illness without a fever may be sent home if the nurse feels this is in the best interest of the child or the child's classmates (with compromised immune systems).

Colds:

Children with an upper respiratory infection without a fever may attend school if they feel well enough to do so. It is helpful in preventing the spread of illness if children learn to use tissues to cover sneezes and coughs, and wash hands after contact with the secretions.

Infections:

Any child who has been on antibiotic therapy for 24 hours is no longer considered infectious and may return to school. This includes infections of the eye, nose(green discharge), skin and strep infections. (Exception is pink eye, not all doctors treat this, so the doctor or nurse will decide if exclusion is necessary to protect others from being contaminated).

Diarrhea:

Children with diarrhea should remain home until they are symptom free for 24 hours. The only exception is if diarrhea is the result of a chronic condition, then a note from the doctor is needed indicating the diarrhea is not infectious.

Vomiting

A child who has vomited the evening before or in the morning before school should remain home for the day.

Rash:

If your child has a rash all over his body (bright red, raised, or itchy) or a rash in one or more areas that is draining fluid. The nurse will determine the next action to be taken.

Common Childhood Diseases

If a child has chicken pox, measles, or any other known treatable contagious disease, they must be kept home until they are no longer contagious. For most common childhood diseases, the period of contagion is known. Consult Nurse Drogosz.



- View their student's grades and missing assignments






Setting Account Information
