

"Hamadi" by Naomi Shihab Nye. In this short story, students read about characters who build relationships rather than focusing on differences and separation.


They consider the unit's essential question from a different perspective as they think about the ways building community can affect individuals and the larger society.

**5th grade:** Students will continue the Folded Layer Landscape project by drawing images in the background, middleground and background. We will also being painting or coloring our landscapes.











### Message from Nurse Drogosz

### \*\*IMPORTANT REMINDER

### Common Illness & School Attendance Reminder

Students are expected to attend school every day. However, illnesses can be lengthy and sometimes difficult deciding whether or not to send your child to school. The following information may be helpful in making your decision. Please be sure and provide your current phone number and the available emergency contact information. If your child is going to be absent, please call our attendance line-(708)-467-3650. You must leave your child's name, the reason for the absence, the date of the absence and your name to verify that it was a parent/guardian that is verifying the absence.

#### Fever:

Any temperature greater than 100 degrees F is considered a fever. Child must be fever free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medications (such as Tylenol, Motrin, Advil, etc.) in order to return to school. This applies even if the underlying cause of the fever is non-infectious, such as middle ear infections, bronchitis, urinary tract infections, etc. Children with a fever do not usually feel well enough to participate and attend school activities. It is recommended that they be given 24 hours to recover from the fever before returning to school. Please note that a child who exhibits symptoms of illness without a fever may be sent home if the nurse feels this is in the best interest of the child or the child's classmates (with compromised immune systems).

#### Colds:

Children with an upper respiratory infection without a fever may attend school if they feel well enough to do so. It is helpful in preventing the spread of illness if children learn to use tissues to cover sneezes and coughs, and wash hands after contact with the secretions.

#### Infections:

Any child who has been on antibiotic therapy for 24 hours is no longer considered infectious and may return to school. This includes infections of the eye, nose(green discharge), skin and strep infections. (Exception is pink eye, not all doctors treat this, so the doctor or nurse will decide if exclusion is necessary to protect others from being contaminated).

### Diarrhea:

Children with diarrhea should remain home until they are symptom free for 24 hours. The only exception is if diarrhea is the result of a chronic condition, then a note from the doctor is needed indicating the diarrhea is not infectious.

#### **Vomiting**

A child who has vomited the evening before or in the morning before school should remain home for the day.

### Rash:

If your child has a rash all over his body (bright red, raised, or itchy) or a rash in one or more areas that is draining fluid. The nurse will determine the next action to be taken.

### **Common Childhood Diseases**

If a child has chicken pox, measles, or any other known treatable contagious disease, they must be kept home until they are no longer contagious. For most common childhood diseases, the period of contagion is known. Consult Nurse Drogosz.

### Enfermedades comunes y recordatorio de asistencia escolar

Se espera que los estudiantes asistan a la escuela todos los días. Sin embargo, la decisión de enviar o no a su hijo a la escuela puede ser larga y a veces difícil. La siguiente información puede ser útil para tomar su decisión. Por favor, asegúrese y proporcione su número de teléfono actual y la información de contacto de emergencia disponible. Si su hijo va a estar ausente, por favor llame a nuestra línea de asistencia. Usted debe dejar el nombre de su niño, la razón de la ausencia, la fecha de la ausencia y su nombre para verificar que fue un padre/guardián que está verificando la ausencia.

#### Fiebre:

Cualquier temperatura mayor de 100 grados F se considera fiebre. El niño debe estar sin fiebre durante 24 horas sin usar medicamentos antifebriles (como Tylenol, Motrin, Advil, etc.) para poder regresar a la escuela. Esto se aplica incluso si la causa subyacente de la fiebre no es infecciosa, como infecciones del oído medio, bronquitis, infecciones del tracto urinario, etc. Los niños con fiebre no suelen encontrarse lo suficientemente bien como para participar y asistir a las actividades escolares. Se recomienda darles 24 horas para que se recuperen de la fiebre antes de volver al colegio. Tenga en cuenta que un niño que presente síntomas de enfermedad sin fiebre puede ser enviado a casa si la enfermera considera que es lo mejor para él o para sus compañeros de clase (con sistemas inmunitarios comprometidos).

#### Resfriados:

Los niños con una infección de las vías respiratorias superiores sin fiebre pueden asistir a la escuela si se sienten lo suficientemente bien para ello. Para prevenir la propagación de la enfermedad, es útil que los niños aprendan a utilizar pañuelos de papel para taparse los estornudos y la tos, y a lavarse las manos después de entrar en contacto con las secreciones.

#### Infecciones:

Cualquier niño que haya estado en tratamiento antibiótico durante 24 horas ya no se considera infeccioso y puede volver a la escuela. Esto incluye infecciones oculares, nasales, cutáneas y estreptocócicas. (La excepción es la conjuntivitis, que no todos los médicos tratan, por lo que el médico o la enfermera decidirán si la exclusión es necesaria para proteger a los demás de ser contaminados).

#### Diarrea:

Los niños con diarrea deben permanecer en casa hasta que no presenten síntomas durante 24 horas. La única excepción es si la diarrea es el resultado de una enfermedad crónica, entonces se necesita una nota del médico indicando que la diarrea no es infecciosa.

#### Vómitos

Un niño que ha vomitado la noche anterior o por la mañana antes de ir al colegio debe permanecer en casa todo el día.

#### **Erupciones:**

Si su hijo tiene una erupción en todo el cuerpo (de color rojo vivo, elevada o con picor) o una erupción en una o varias zonas que supura líquido. La enfermera determinará la siguiente medida a tomar. Enfermedades infantiles comunes Si un niño tiene varicela, sarampión o cualquier otra enfermedad contagiosa tratable conocida, debe quedarse en casa hasta que deje de ser contagiosa. Para la mayoría de las enfermedades infantiles comunes, se conoce el periodo de contagio. Consulte a la enfermera Drogosz.

Willow Springs School District # 108, 8345 Archer Ave, Willow Springs IL 60480, will hold a transitional kindergarten (4 year olds) **pre-registration and screening** on Tuesday, March 5, 2024. Registration will take place from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The screening of your child is very important and will take approximately 30-45minutes.

If your child will be <u>four years old on or before September 1, 2024</u>, and has not qualified for Early Childhood Special Education programming he/she might be eligible to enter our transitional kindergarten program for the 2024/2025 school year. This program is an open enrollment-lottery system\*.

\*If students have a fourth birthday after September 1, 2024, and there are open seats in the classroom, the parent may register their child on or after their birthday in order to attend the Transitional Kindergarten program and begin on a rolling admission.

In order to pre-register your child, you must bring with you **ONE** proof of residency. This must be a current State ID, Driver's License, lease, mortgage bill, or property tax bill. A copy of your child's original Birth Certificate is also required. ONLY the parent and the child should attend this appointment.
