





# 6th Grade <u>The Forces That Shape Us</u>

Next week students will read and analyze "Hard to Say" by Sharon Morse. Through this short story, students will gain an understanding about how the external forces of language and family shape a character's identity. They will consider the unit's essential question — What Shapes who we are? — and take this idea further to consider how different aspects of our identity can create internal conflict. Students will also analyze how an author uses characterization to develop a theme.

## 7th Grade Fractured Fairy Tales

This week students are finishing their fractured fairy tale! Students are reading stories and learning to identify transition words, phrases, and clauses to convey sequence and signal shifts from one setting to another. Students will then apply these narrative elements to create their own fractured fairy tale. Students are going on a field trip to see a fractured fairy tale next week Students are also reviewing skills in preparation for their IAR test that they will take after break.

#### 8th Grade

Students began their new novel study of Night, by Elie Wiesel. Students have been studying the characters and setting of Section 1, pages 3-22. Within Section 1 of the book, students also focused on tracing the theme of delusion as well as the repetition of the title word, NIGHT.

Next week there will be a test over section one and the theme of night and delusion.

We will continue to work through sections 2 and 3 next week.

In this topic, students need to understand solving an equation as a process of reasoning to determine what numbers make equations true. Students will complete a Quick Check on equations by the end of the week.

#### Compound Probability

7

In this topic, students build on their understanding of probability concepts from Introduction to Probability. They use arrays and lists to organize the possible outcomes of an experiment that includes two simple events. Students calculate experimental and theoretical probabilities of events and use proportional reasoning to determine percent error and to make predictions of expected numbers of outcomes. Students will complete a Quick Check on compound probability by the end of the week.

- Using the Pythagorean Theorem to determine unknown side lengths in right triangles in mathematical and real-world problems in two and three dimensions.
- Using square root and cube root symbols to represent solutions to equations
- Using the Converse of the Pythagorean Theorem to determine whether a given triangle is a right triangle.
- Applying the Pythagorean Theorem to determine the distance between two points in a coordinate system and the lengths of diagonals in two and three-dimensional figures.

## HAPPY ST. PATRICK'S DAY

St. Patrick's Day is celebrated annually on March 17, the anniversary of his death in the fifth century. St. Patrick's Day 2024 will take place on Sunday, March 17. The Irish have observed this day as a religious holiday for over 1,000 years. On St. Patrick's Day, which falls during the Christian season of Lent, Irish families would traditionally attend church in the morning and celebrate in the afternoon. Lenten prohibitions against the consumption of meat were waived and people would dance, drink and feast on the traditional meal of Irish bacon and cabbage.

El Día de San Patricio se celebra anualmente el 17 de marzo, el aniversario de su muerte en el siglo V. El Día de San Patricio de 2024 tendrá lugar el domingo 17 de marzo. Los irlandeses han observado este día como una festividad religiosa durante más de 1,000 años. En el Día de San Patricio, que coincide con la temporada cristiana de Cuaresma, las familias irlandesas tradicionalmente asistirían a la iglesia por la mañana y celebrarían por la tarde. Las prohibiciones cuaresmales contra el consumo de carne eran levantadas y la gente bailaba, bebía y se daba un festín con la comida tradicional de tocino y col irlandés.

Saint Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint of Ireland and its national apostle. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at 16. He later escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited with bringing Christianity to its people. San Patricio, quien vivió durante el siglo V, es el patrón santo de Irlanda y su apóstol nacional. Nacido en la Britania romana, fue secuestrado y llevado a Irlanda como esclavo a los 16 años. Más tarde escapó, pero regresó a Irlanda y se le atribuye haber llevado el cristianismo a su pueblo.

Islamic tradition states that it was during Ramadan, on the "Night of Power" (Caylat al-Qadr)—commemorated on one of the last 10 nights of Ramadan, usually the 27th night—that God revealed to the Prophet Muhammad the Qur'ān, Islam's holy book, "as a guidance for the people."

# Ramadan Mubarak: Celebrating the Muslim Holy Month

Ramadan Mubarak! Meaning "Blessed Ramadan," this greeting is often shared during the holy month of fasting recognized by Muslims around the world. You might also hear Ramadan Kareem, meaning "Generous Ramadan." Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic lunar calendar. This year Ramadan began the evening of March 10. The Muslim community started with the late-night congregational prayers called "Taraweeh," and the observation of fasting began before sunrise on March 23. (It continues daily between sunrise and sunset.) The observance culminates on April 21 with Eid al-Fitr, meaning "festival of breaking the fast" in Arabic.

## Message from Nurse Drogosz

#### \*\*IMPORTANT REMINDER

#### **Common Illness & School Attendance Reminder**

Students are expected to attend school every day. However, illnesses can be lengthy and sometimes difficult deciding whether or not to send your child to school. The following information may be helpful in making your decision. Please be sure and provide your current phone number and the available emergency contact information. If your child is going to be absent, please call our attendance line-(708)-467-3650. You must leave your child's name, the reason for the absence, the date of the absence and your name to verify that it was a parent/guardian that is verifying the absence.

#### Fever:

Any temperature greater than 100 degrees F is considered a fever. Child must be fever free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medications (such as Tylenol, Motrin, Advil, etc.) in order to return to school. This applies even if the underlying cause of the fever is non-infectious, such as middle ear infections, bronchitis, urinary tract infections, etc. Children with a fever do not usually feel well enough to participate and attend school activities. It is recommended that they be given 24 hours to recover from the fever before returning to school. Please note that a child who exhibits symptoms of illness without a fever may be sent home if the nurse feels this is in the best interest of the child or the child's classmates (with compromised immune systems).

#### Colds:

Children with an upper respiratory infection without a fever may attend school if they feel well enough to do so. It is helpful in preventing the spread of illness if children learn to use tissues to cover sneezes and coughs, and wash hands after contact with the secretions.

#### Infections:

Any child who has been on antibiotic therapy for 24 hours is no longer considered infectious and may return to school. This includes infections of the eye, nose(green discharge), skin and strep infections. (Exception is pink eye, not all doctors treat this, so the doctor or nurse will decide if exclusion is necessary to protect others from being contaminated).

#### Diarrhea:

Children with diarrhea should remain home until they are symptom free for 24 hours. The only exception is if diarrhea is the result of a chronic condition, then a note from the doctor is needed indicating the diarrhea is not infectious.

#### **Vomiting**

A child who has vomited the evening before or in the morning before school should remain home for the day.

#### Rash:

If your child has a rash all over his body (bright red, raised, or itchy) or a rash in one or more areas that is draining fluid. The nurse will determine the next action to be taken.

#### **Common Childhood Diseases**

If a child has chicken pox, measles, or any other known treatable contagious disease, they must be kept home until they are no longer contagious. For most common childhood diseases, the period of contagion is known. Consult Nurse Drogosz.
