

Dear Willow Families,

On Monday, April 8th, Willow Springs School will be along the path of a total solar eclipse. A total solar eclipse occurs when the Moon passes between the Sun and Earth and completely blocks the face of the Sun. The sky darkens as if it were dusk. NASA indicates this will be the last total solar eclipse visible from the United States until 2044. This event has been widely anticipated across the county, and I wanted to communicate to our families important information and safety precautions we are taking as a school district.

This Solar Eclipse presents a unique learning opportunity for our students and staff. To ensure safety for all, the District has purchased a pair of Solar Eclipse Glasses for each student and staff member. Please be aware that the only safe way to look directly at the eclipsed or partially eclipsed sun is through special-purpose solar filters, such as certified eclipse viewing eyewear.

These glasses meet the requirements of the 2024 International Organization for Standardization (12312-2 compliant) and Certified Eclipse glasses (European Health Standards) for Optical Quality for <u>Safe and Direct Sun viewing for the Solar Eclipse</u>.

While I encourage our community to embrace this unique and exciting educational opportunity, I respect that some families may not want their student(s) to view the Solar Eclipse. That being said, if you wish to pick up your student(s) so that they may be directly supervised by their guardian, please call the front office to arrange the early pickup. Students must be picked up from school no later than 12:30 PM on Monday, April 8, 2024.

Willow staff will use their professional judgment in determining the level of participation for students. Willow students participating in viewing the eclipse will be required to wear the protective glasses while outside of our school.

Please be aware that the end of the eclipse will overlap with our school's dismissal time. Willow school will dismiss following our normal schedule on April 8th. All students will receive a pair of glasses regardless of whether or not they participate in viewing the eclipse. These glasses will belong to the students once they have been distributed. Please be sure to have the appropriate conversations with your children about the importance of not looking up into the sky on their way home from school.

I ask that you complete the following form for <u>each student within your family</u> to ensure that we are respecting your wishes as it relates to participating in the viewing of the Solar Eclipse.

**IMPORTANT REMINDER

Common Illness & School Attendance Reminder

Students are expected to attend school every day. However, illnesses can be lengthy and sometimes difficult deciding whether or not to send your child to school. The following information may be helpful in making your decision. Please be sure and provide your current phone number and the available emergency contact information. If your child is going to be absent, please call our attendance line-(708)-467-3650. You must leave your child's name, the reason for the absence, the date of the absence and your name to verify that it was a parent/guardian that is verifying the absence.

Fever:

Any temperature greater than 100 degrees F is considered a fever. Child must be fever free for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medications (such as Tylenol, Motrin, Advil, etc.) in order to return to school. This applies even if the underlying cause of the fever is non-infectious, such as middle ear infections, bronchitis, urinary tract infections, etc. Children with a fever do not usually feel well enough to participate and attend school activities. It is recommended that they be given 24 hours to recover from the fever before returning to school. Please note that a child who exhibits symptoms of illness without a fever may be sent home if the nurse feels this is in the best interest of the child or the child's classmates (with compromised immune systems).

Colds:

Children with an upper respiratory infection without a fever may attend school if they feel well enough to do so. It is helpful in preventing the spread of illness if children learn to use tissues to cover sneezes and coughs, and wash hands after contact with the secretions.

Infections:

Any child who has been on antibiotic therapy for 24 hours is no longer considered infectious and may return to school. This includes infections of the eye, nose(green discharge), skin and strep infections. (Exception is pink eye, not all doctors treat this, so the doctor or nurse will decide if exclusion is necessary to protect others from being contaminated).

Diarrhea:

Children with diarrhea should remain home until they are symptom free for 24 hours. The only exception is if diarrhea is the result of a chronic condition, then a note from the doctor is needed indicating the diarrhea is not infectious.

Vomiting

A child who has vomited the evening before or in the morning before school should remain home for the day.

Rash:

If your child has a rash all over his body (bright red, raised, or itchy) or a rash in one or more areas that is draining fluid. The nurse will determine the next action to be taken.

Common Childhood Diseases

If a child has chicken pox, measles, or any other known treatable contagious disease, they must be kept home until they are no longer contagious. For most common childhood diseases, the period of contagion is known. Consult Nurse Drogosz.
